

DESERT WARRIOR PROGENY ON A TEAR – FIVE WINNERS IN THREE DAYS!

DESERT WARRIOR'S progeny is on a roll as two winners today at Finger Lakes and Suffolk Downs, respectively, raised the number of winners to five since Friday, July 24th.

At the "Lakes" SPA PRINCESS, a four-year old chestnut filly, crushed an allowance



field by 8-lengths to register her third consecutive multiple length score and raised her lifetime earnings to \$120,216 in 22-career starts. The victory, also, qualified her breeders for a \$2,652 award from the New York Breeding and Racing Program.

Three-year old chestnut filly PAPA CHARLIE, entered for a tag of \$25,000, also was a repeat winner by multiple lengths (3) at Suffolk Downs in Massachusetts. Papa Charlie has now won three-races in 14-lifetime starts.

Previous Desert Warrior sired winners since July 24th were DESALOOT at Columbus Racetrack in Nebraska, FOUR STAR GENERAL at Belmont Park and SERVE TOO at Colonial Downs in Virginia.

With three-crops of racing age, 53 of which are two-year olds, Desert Warrior has demonstrated his ability to sire hard-hitting racehorses, who have earned over \$1.4-million to date. His multiple stakes winning dam, Navajo Pass by Secretariat, is a full-sister to multiple graded stakes winners Terlinqua, dam of Storm Cat, and Pancho Villa; and she's a half-sister to multiple Grade I winner Royal Academy (Nijinsky II) who won the 1990 Breeder's Cup Mile.

Desert Warrior is listed second on the 'Third-Year Sires Listings' based on horses conceived in New York State.
