

**WHEELAWAY'S BRUCEONTHELOOSE WINS SECOND LEG OF T & T's TRIPLE CROWN SERIES – Aug. 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2009**

BRUCEONTHELOOSE, a three-year old gray/roan son of Wheelaway, added another victory notch onto his girth winning the Trinidad and Tobago Midsummer Classic by almost six-lengths. Raced at Santa Rosa Park in Trinidad, "Bruce," who had formerly been trained by 14-time champion trainer Philip Feanny in Jamaica was racing for the first time for new conditioner John O'Brien.

With 15-horses entered in the approximately mile and three-sixteenths event, "Bruce" broke from the "lucky" 13<sup>th</sup> post with a quick turn of foot to gain forwardly placed position in the approximately 1-3/16ths mile event. With Florida-based Venezuelan jockey Wilmer Galviz aboard, "Bruce" pressed the pace before moving easily to the front extending the margin with every powerful stride through the stretch to win much as he pleased.

Plans outlined by part-owner Herbert Chung of Tres Amigos for the 3-year old gelding are to remain in Trinidad to contest the Royal Oak Derby. The T & T Classic victory, worth \$78,000US, gives "Bruce" his sixth win out of seven starts in 2009.

Voted the 2008 Two-Year old Champion, "Bruce" is out of the Lit De Justice mare Road To Justice and was bred by HAM Stables of Jamaica.

His sire, Wheelaway, stands at McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds. With four crops of racing age including 78-two year olds, Wheelaway has sired 5-stakes winners and has progeny earnings surpassing \$3.3-million for average earnings of \$25,908.
