

DESERT WARRIOR'S PROGENY CONTINUE ON ROLL – DEVI IS LATEST ALLOWANCE WINNER – September, 19, 2009

DEVI easily registered her fifth-career victory today in a \$21,700 allowance race going six-furlongs at Finger Lakes Racetrack. Devi was sired by Desert Warrior and is out of the unraced Devilish Sly, who's a full-sister to the multiple stakes winner So Sweet a Cat (\$439,048), by Tomorrows Cat. Both Devi and So Sweet a Cat were bred and raced by Ms. Jane Freed, a longtime client of McMahan of Saratoga Thoroughbreds. Today's victory qualified Ms. Freed for a 20% breeder's award (\$2,604), which is part of the lucrative New York Breeding and Racing Program.



Trained by Ralph D'Alessandro, Devi was ridden by jockey Paul Nicol Jr, who has been aboard the dark bay filly in her last five starts and obviously fits the filly like a glove having guided Devi to three-victories and two-second place finishes.

Desert Warrior is currently atop New York's third-crop leading sire list in terms of winning-percentage with an impressive 46% of winners to runners. The McMahan of Saratoga Thoroughbreds-based Desert Warrior has progeny earnings exceeding

\$800,000 in 2009 and over \$1.6-million overall.
